The meeting was called to order at 7:30 pm, PBA President Gail Stout presiding.

Presidents Report:

Gail Stout greeted the parents and thanked all volunteers involved in PBA activities.

Directors Reports:

Nancy Waring , Associate Director of the Pioneer Bands, described the Varsity Band's rehearsal night as one of enthusiasm with students even showing up early to help. The over 137 students played very well. Student's Solo and Ensemble pieces should be ready before the winter break; make sure there is an original for the judges and contact an accompanist. Ms. Waring explained she is currently seeking requests from the students regarding Picnic Pop pieces.

David Leach, Director of the Pioneer Bands, stated the Jazz Band played wonderfully at the Firefly Club and were invited back. Also, New Horizons Tour and Travel have requested the Jazz Band to play at a corporate function. Shawn Dobbins will be playing at the Winter Concert. During chair auditions, Mr. Leach stated he was able to use a program to record the auditions, convert those recordings to iTunes, and then play each on the iPod in order to compare student. Chair positions have been posted. Symphony Band is currently practicing for the Winter Concert. Michael Haithcock, Director of Bands at the University of Michigan, will be conducting "Molly on the Shore" by Percy Grainger during Bands in Review. Scott Boerma, from EMU, has written "Cauldron" which will be performed by the Concert Band. He has been invited to conduct Concert Band at Picnic Pops. Mr. Leach announced that if District Festival is to be held at another school then Pioneer will not be attending. Mr. Leach stated he is in the process of having new Symphony Band marching uniforms designed. The proposal has been written and when approved will be sent out for bid. Whatever company is chosen will present mockups of the uniforms before a decision is made. The School Board presentation was great. A presentation on the Austria tour was given.
